

Did you know?

- **Ohio ranks 19th across the nation in its Latino eligible voter population** with 199,000 eligible Latinos.
- 42.4 percent of eligible Ohio Latino voters classify as Millennials.
- **Immigration is not the number one concern for U.S. Latino voters.** According to a PEW Research study, the economy is the number one issue for Latino voters, followed by healthcare.
- As of June 2015, there are **15 Latino elected officials in Ohio serving in local government roles and on public school boards.**
- Political participation in the Latino community has lagged behind other voting groups for many years. **Only 31% of Latinos voted in the 2010 midterm election, compared to 49% of Caucasians and 44% of African Americans.**
