

Growing Impact

Ohio's population is shrinking – except for immigrants and New Americans, and especially growth in the Hispanic & Latino community.

The need to help these new Ohioans integrate with life in the United States has never been greater.

THE PLAIN DEALER

According to the 2008 American Community Survey Ohio's Hispanic community is comprised of about 300,000 people, accounting for 2.5% of the Ohio population. Ohio's Hispanic population has more than doubled since 1980.


- 290,543 - 2.5% of the Ohio population
- 29.5% percent increase in population since 2000
- 69,000 were born outside the U.S.
- 51 percent are of Mexican ancestry



A mosaic

- Nearly half of the Hispanic population is Mexican, and nearly 30% is Puerto Rican.
- 1 in every 48 persons in Ohio is Latino.
- About 1 of every 6 people added to Ohio's population b/w 2000 and 2006 was Latino.


- Nearly 75% of the Latino population is native born.
- From 1990 to 2000 the Latino population growth in Ohio for the age group 0-15 years was 52.2%, compared to an overall population growth of only 2.2% in this age group.
- Of all children under age 18 in Ohio in 2007, 147,342 or 5.7 percent resided in immigrant families (i.e., with at least one foreign-born parent).
- Of all children with immigrant parents in Ohio, 80.1 percent were US citizens by birth.



Contribution to the Economy

- There are more than 7,100 Hispanic-owned businesses in Ohio.
- Of that number, businesses with a payroll total 1,345 and, combined, employ more than 11,300 workers with an annual payroll of more than \$270 million.
- Receipts for those businesses top \$1 billion with receipts for all Hispanic-run businesses approaching \$1.3 billion.
- The health care and social assistance sector represents 16% of all Hispanic businesses compared to 9% for the state as a whole. Retail is second coming in at 12%.

Service to the Country



- According to the Department of Veterans Affairs, there are 11,000 Hispanic Veterans in Ohio.
- Four percent of Ohio Latinos are also Veterans.



English-Speaking



- There are 59,738 *foreign-born* Ohioans who are Spanish-speaking. Of those, 54% also speak English well' or 'very well.'
- There are 158,067 *native-born* Ohioans who are Spanish-speaking. Of those, 87% speak English 'well' or 'very well.'
- Only 14% of the Hispanic foreign-born population report speaking English "not at all."
