All Blood Types are important, O-negative blood is specially valued as it is the universal red blood cell. Hispanics have a higher number of O blood types than other populations, creating a unique opportunity for giving. Almost sixty percent of Hispanic Americans have type O blood, while nationally only 45% of the population have type O. Because of this significant difference, recruiting new Latino donors is particularly important.
