Brief Description: The Ohio Commission on Minority Health announces the availability of funds to support Lupus programming focusing on patients and public education grants. Grant funds will not exceed \$14,000 per applicant agency. The availability of a Request for Proposal (RFP)-The Systemic Lupus Erythematosus 2016-2017 RFP. Brief Description: Health and Human Services Secretary Sylvia M. Burwell today announced \$386 million in grant awards to states, territories, and nonprofit organizations to support the Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting Program (Home Visiting Program). These funds will allow states to continue to expand voluntary, evidence-based home visiting services to women during pregnancy and to parents with young children.

Brief Description: Division of Prevention and Health Promotion, Bureau of Healthy Ohio (BHO) announces the availability of grant funds to provide up to two programs through the Sexual Assault Services Program. Funds will be available to provide direct services for survivors of sexual assault in Asian American, African American and/or African/Black, and/or Hispanic communities.

The purpose of this grant opportunity is to fund an applicant/lead agency which will issue sub-contracts to create a network of support for one or more culturally specific community organizations (CSCO), in order to support their provision of sexual assault crisis intervention services to survivors in their community. The applicant/lead agency must show a history of collaboration with the partner CSCOs and either have experience in the area of sexual assault crisis intervention or also partner with an organization having such experience.

4. Next click "Grant Request for Proposals," this will give you a pull down menu with current RFPs by name; and

EDUCATION

The Obama Administration released a fiscal year 2016 budget that included key investments to expand high-quality early learning programs; increase equity and opportunity for all students; support teachers and school leaders; and improve access, affordability and student outcomes in college

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA): to ensure as many high school students as possible complete their Free Application for Federal Student Aid

Federal Pell Grant - A federal grant for undergraduate students with financial need.

Elementary and Secondary Education Act - to ensure that all students – which includes poor and minority students, students with disabilities, and English learners - graduate from high school prepared for college and careers

Individuals with Disabilities Education Act Part B grants to support the work that states are doing to improve results for children with disabilities and another \$115 million for programs for younger children with disabilities

Preschool for All - proposal to provide universal high-quality preschool programs for all 4-year-olds from low- and moderate-income families

Preschool Development Grants, an increase of \$500 million, to help states lay the foundation for universal public preschool

America's College Promise would provide two years of free community college for responsible students through a \$60.3 billion investment in a new federal-state partnership over the next 10 years

First in the World grants that take the same approach to improving outcomes in higher education

TECH EDUCATION

Brief Description: CODE2040, founded in 2012, is one of several nonprofit groups partnering with tech giants. The San Francisco-based group says it has graduated nearly 50 fellows through its mentorship program, many of whom have gone on to work at companies like Facebook, LinkedIn and Jawbone. The group's name refers to the year when the population of minorities in the U.S. is projected to surpass that of whites. One of Google's grants will help CODE2040 create a program aimed at training black and Latino students how to apply for an interview for a technical job or internship. Laura Weidman Powers, the group's co-founder and chief executive, said minorities are often at a disadvantage when seeking out and interviewing for jobs because they lack instruction on how to prepare.
