**Brief Description:** The Office of Minority Health (OMH) at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services announces the availability of funds for Fiscal Year (FY) 2015 for the National Workforce Diversity Pipeline Program (NWDP). The NWDP focuses on support for projects that develop innovative strategies to identify promising students in their first year of high school and provide them with a foundation to pursue successful careers in health professions. The program seeks to address health disparities among racial and ethnic minorities by supporting networks of institutions focused on and with demonstrated commitment and capacity to establish pipeline programs to increase minority and disadvantaged students' awareness and pursuit of careers in health care and behavioral health, and to increase the availability of science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) education programs. Range of Awards \$350,000 to \$500,000. Application Deadline May 18, 2015 by 5 PM EDT. **Brief Description:** The Office of Minority Health (OMH) at the United States Department of Health and Human Services announces the availability of funds for Fiscal Year (FY) 2015 for the National Health Education Program on Lupus (NHEPL). The purpose of the NHEPL is to reduce lupus-related health disparities among racial and ethnic minority populations disproportionately affected by this disease by conducting a national lupus education initiative that includes the general public, health professionals and student trainees in targeted communities, schools and health care systems and practices. The NHEPL will target individuals, patients, communities, and practicing professionals in geographic areas and populations where lupus is more prevalent. Range of Awards \$350,000 to \$500,000. Application Deadline May 18, 5 PM EDT.

**Brief Description:** Health and Human Services announced \$386 million in grant awards to states, territories, and nonprofit organizations to support the Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting Program (Home Visiting Program). These funds will allow states to continue to expand voluntary, evidence-based home visiting services to women during pregnancy and to parents with young children.

**Brief Description:** The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), Administration for Children and Families (ACF), Office of Family Assistance (OFA) announced awarding cooperative agreements to support demonstration projects that are designed to provide eligible individuals with the opportunity to obtain education and training for occupations in the health care field; also providing education and training services, funds for this project may be used for child care, case management, and other supportive services as appropriate. Deadline 05/29/2015 and letter of intent by 04/29/2015.

## YOUTH

**Brief Description:** Workforce and Youth Employment, Labor and Training Administration announces the availability of approximately \$76 million in grant funds authorized by the Youth Build provisions of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act. DOL will award grants through a competitive process to organizations to oversee the provision of education, occupational skills training, and employment services to disadvantaged youth in their communities while performing meaningful work and service to their communities. In Fiscal Year (FY) 2015, DOL hopes to serve approximately 4,950 participants during the grant period of performance, with approximately 76 projects awarded across the country. Individual grants will range from **\$700,000 to \$1.1 million and require an exact 25 percent match from applicants**, using sources other than federal funding. The grant period of performance for this FOA is 40 months, including a four-month planning period. Deadline June 5, 2015 at 4 PM Eastern Time.
