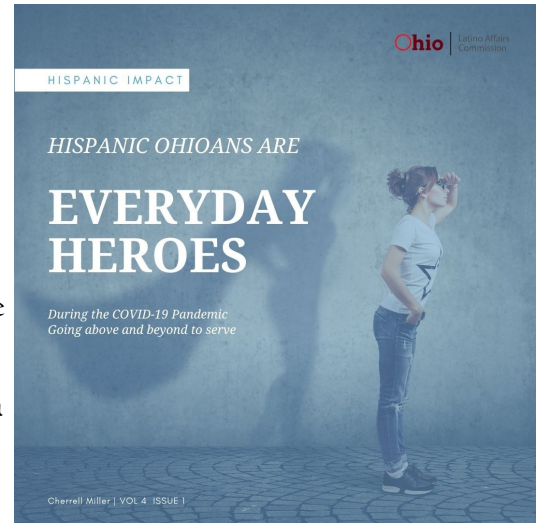
To the Honorable Board Members of the Ohio Commission on Hispanic/Latino Affairs

During the month of September, Director Cavanaugh has been working with Thalia Amador to enter into a Strategic Alliance with OCHLA and the Small Business Administration. This alliance will enable the commission to partner for business development programs with the SBA to help start, maintain and expand small businesses. Our primary goal will be to meet the needs of the small business community and expand our capacity to produce impact in the area of business development. We expect to have the Memorandum document reviewed by our Attorney General, approved by the Executive Committee and signed in the month of October.

ODC Coordinator Lanese participated on Sept 15th on the [Ohio Grants Summit](#), a day long event hosted by the state of Ohio to provide information on how apply for and receive grant funding from the State of Ohio. The summit covered key topics including how to navigate grants during COVID-19, what subrecipients should know, Grants Policy and Procedures, COVID -19 Grants Compliance Issues, Disaster Funding and other relevant topics related to state of Ohio government issued grants. The commission will use this information to assist community organizations and be better prepared for future grant funding opportunities. Additionally, Director Cavanaugh participated in the Workforce and Education Symposium, AIM Hire, Ohio Excels, Office of Workforce Transformation. The program is focused on discussions and plans to bridge Ohio's workforce gap, as part of the [Workforce and Education Symposium Series](#). Education, business and community leaders have the opportunity to join policymakers to strengthen collaboration with the goal of better preparing Ohioans for the in-demand jobs of today's economy and to learn about the recently released Bridging Ohio's Workforce Gap report.



This month we completed the first interview in the series **Hispanic Impact Campaign, Special Edition on “Every Day Heroes During the COVID-19 Pandemic”** with a feature on [Elena Schemmel from Cincinnati](#). The stories will be running from October through February 2021.



We continue to collaborate in the planning of the [Virtual Summit Latina Equal Pay Day](#) on October 29th. Registration is open and a robust program has been prepared with national caliber speakers leading the different plenaries. Details on the Summit Program can be found [here](#). Additionally, PPC Officer McCain has continued work with the Voter Registration Outreach and a specific call for Latinos to volunteer as Poll Workers on Election Day. The bilingual social media campaigns are having good results and wide visibility. Also, Annette Reyes has continued working on our Census 2020 Campaign which is coming to a close in the short term. We are very thankful for her dedication to this effort and for enabling the commission to have a visible presence in social media on this important project.

On Sept 23, ODC Coordinator Lanese and Lair Marin (on behalf of Director Cavanaugh) hosted the quarterly meeting with Ohio’s Hispanic Chambers to follow up on their status and provide updates regarding COVID-19 challenges and funding opportunities for businesses.

Public Policy Center (PPC) Report

Summary of Successes

-**Tracking and Communication of Education-related Resources:** Worked with internal staff to track ODE and other government resources that are relevant to our community, specifically in relation to students, parents, and families. This information is distributed in English and Spanish amongst our team so that we may post it on our website, social media, and distribute it amongst our networks.

-**2020 Ohio Latino Affairs Summit:** Worked with internal staff to establish clear standards, guidelines, and deadlines



for the planning of each track of the Summit. The Public Policy Center is in charge of planning the Education track of the Summit and has reached out to various education and higher education professionals to collaborate on refining different breakout sessions. Cleveland Clinic Collaboration Project: The Public Policy Center has teamed up with Dr. Marilyn Sampilo, to assist in a research project with her residents at the Cleveland Clinic. We seek to examine the current state of DACA in Ohio and what kind of an impact it has on mental health. The Cleveland Clinic will publish a report and the Public Policy Center is advising them in areas of public policy that are relevant to DACA recipients and those that are close to them. The goal of this project is to help the residents at the Cleveland Clinic use their expertise to advocate for populations they serve while helping to present this policy issue.

Voter Education: The Public Policy Center has lead the team in voter education outreach. The focus in September was on voter registration because the deadline to register to vote in Ohio is Monday, October 5. After that, we will focus on voter education in terms of promoting the different ways to safely vote in Ohio.

Public Policy Center Update: The Public Policy Center released its quarterly Public Policy Center update. This edition of the publication focused heavily on voter registration information and included information about legislative activity and our latest Latino Community Report about The Digital Divide.

September was a great month for the commission as our social media profiles continue to rise in traffic. On Twitter, we nearly doubled in likes, views, mentions, engagements, and reach. There were over 100 posts throughout Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram as we began Hispanic Heritage Month and participated in Nation Suicide Prevention Awareness Month. September brought mentions and tags from prominent figures throughout the State of Ohio. Governor Mike DeWine, and Senator Portman acknowledged us for Hispanic Heritage Month on twitter which brought many followers and page views.

This month we saw a rise in job listing submissions, as well as community events, considering the state is re-opening from the pandemic shutdown. The commission created a LinkedIn profile late last month. We are still in the process of gaining traction and are hopeful that the release of our new Hispanic Impact – Special Edition articles, as well as our upcoming summit will increase followers and page views.

Facebook:

On Facebook, the commission reached over 8,000 users in the month of September. The page is close to 2,700 likes and has risen just about 2,700 followers. In January 2020, the page started off with 2,350 page likes and has increased by 350 throughout the span of the year.

Twitter:

The Commission reached 1000 followers at the end of August. Continued engagements with our followers and mentions from the Governor and Senator Rob Portman, drove an increase in followers by 20 in just one month.

Website:

WHEREAS, The members of the Senate of the 133rd General Assembly of Ohio are pleased to recognize September 15-October 15, 2020, as National Hispanic Heritage Month in Ohio; and

WHEREAS, In 1968, President Lyndon Baines Johnson signed legislation creating National Hispanic Heritage Week to acknowledge the contributions of people of Hispanic and Latino origins to the United States and to celebrate these rich cultures as part of our shared American experience. This was expanded to National Hispanic Heritage Month by President Ronald Reagan in 1988, spanning a thirty-day period from September 15 to October 15 each year; and

WHEREAS, Ohioans of Hispanic and Latino descent have enriched the lives of all citizens through their contributions to such fields as business, technology, science, education, religion, entertainment, politics, and the arts. In addition, they have proudly served and defended our nation throughout its history by serving in the United States Armed Forces; and

WHEREAS, According to data provided by Census.gov, Hispanics comprised 18.5 percent of the United States' total population as of July 1, 2019, with twelve states, including Illinois, North Carolina, New York, and Pennsylvania, having populations of one million or more Hispanic residents. In recognition, appreciation, and respect of the contributions of individuals of Hispanic and Latino descent to the Great State of Ohio and to the United States of America, we are honored to pay tribute to National Hispanic Heritage Month; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That we, the members of the Senate of the 133rd General Assembly of Ohio, in adopting this Resolution, recognize September 15-October 15, 2020, as National Hispanic Heritage Month in Ohio; and be it further
