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MARCH 2021

To the Honorable Board Members of the Ohio Commission on Hispanic/Latino Affairs

Our team is actively involved in the COVID-19 response focusing now on the vaccination efforts. Director Cavanaugh continues to serve on the Health Equity Team supporting on the outreach coordination for mass vaccination clinics, particularly at the Cleveland Wolstein Center which launched on March 17th. This clinic is capable of offering up to 6,000 doses per day and it is expected that 210,000 people will be vaccinated during the eight weeks.

The Commission continues to work with Latino serving organizations in Cleveland and the northeast, the Department of Health, Latino media and influencers to encourage our community to take the vaccine. [Farmworkers](#) were able to obtain the vaccine in Cleveland thanks to the work of HOLA, and the Hispanic Roundtable, who along with faith leaders have done an [outstanding job supporting and directing Latinos](#) to the Wolstein Center to get their vaccines.

Our team has also promoted and helped connect organizations and constituents to mass vaccination clinics which took place in Columbus and Cincinnati this month as well and are [actively promoting regional, pop up and mobile](#) vaccination clinics every week.

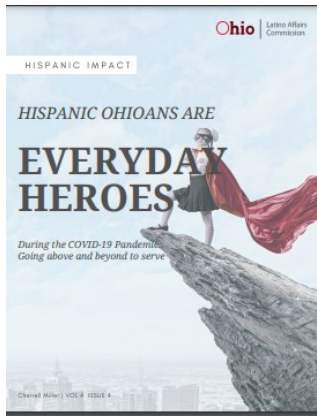
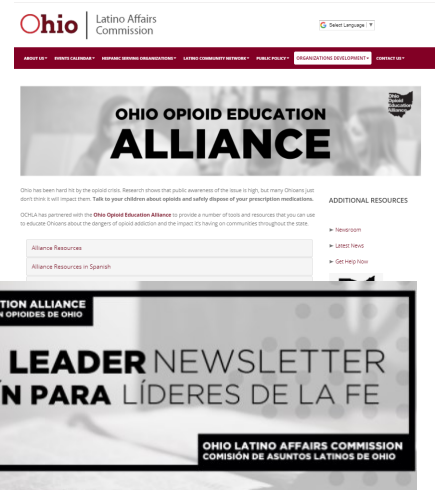
During March, two major milestones were completed for Migrant and Seasonal Workers as well. A COVID—19 Informational [Video with Safety Measures for Ohio's Migrant and Seasonal Farmworkers](#) was produced and is now being shared with growers, workers and migrant serving organizations across Ohio. This educational video will be extremely valuable as workers begin to arrive in Ohio for the 2021 agricultural season. Additionally, our team collaborated with the Ohio Department of Health, Ohio Department of Agriculture and Ohio Department of Job and Family Services to launch the [Migrant and Seasonal Worker Toolkit](#) intended to provide information that will keep everyone healthy and safe. Director Cavanaugh is member of the taskforce that is coordinating mobile vaccination for migrant and seasonal workers which will begin in April with over 1,000 scheduled vaccinations for migrant workers and will continue through the growing season.

In the area of health, the Commission hosted the first [Promotoras de Salud](#) Webinar with over 50 participants registered. The next webinar is scheduled for April and will target more specific



cally organizations that are interested in hosting a Promotoras de Salud Program in their organizations. This month we also launched our Latino Affairs [Bilingual Opioid Resource Page](#) which we are promoting and hope to continue to grow and expand with information for families and organizations. We also co-produced the [first newsletter addressed to Latino Faith leaders](#) to touch on the topic of drug overuse, cosigned by our Commissioner Pastor Juan Rivera.

The PPC Program has been engaging with leaders interested in learning more about potential bills of interest and PPC Officer McCain has been providing guidance on the legislative process and assisting with information. Along with the Policy and Advocacy Committee, work is underway to identify key legislators and secure meetings to introduce the Commission and discuss topics of interest to the different Latino communities they represent.



Our Community Liaison Marin-Marcum and team of volunteers are working steadfast to finalize the OLANet, and CLOI (Catalogue of Latino Outreach Initiatives) Updates which will be ready for distribution by April. Additionally, we launched our last in the series “Hispanics are Every Day Heroes During the COVID-19 Pandemic” [featuring Selina Pagan](#) from Cleveland.

We are also delighted to welcome our new Commissioner Maria Sylvia Martinez from Henry County. She will officially join the Board in April. OCHHA in Youngstown is also announcing its new Executive Director Ms. Angelica Diaz who we had the pleasure to meet this month. Finally, we offer our farewell to AG Maggie O’Shea and thank her for assisting the Commission, while welcoming AG Andrew Roman who join us starting this month.

On the administrative front, we continue our work to revamp the Commission’s website and are pleased to inform that our Commission will be working with the State’s IOP Core Website Solution Team to complete this task. Director Cavanaugh also met with the Auditor’s Office Francis Schwinne to begin preparing for the 2020-2021 Biennial Audit. The fiscal report is included as an attachment to this report and will be discussed at the April board meeting.

Latino Community Network (LCN) Report

During March, we focused on finalizing the OLANet and CLOI updates. There continues to be a spike on constituent inquiries as well. In March, we organized and facilitated meetings with our four Latino networks: Canton, Akron, Youngstown and Springfield. We continue assisting state agencies, supporting with some translation work, connecting to Latino leaders, compiling, updating COVID-19 resources and mailing out to all community networks. It is expected that in April we will transition the weekly email resource update to Mailchimp.

Connecting the Community: Information and Resources

Job Opportunities: During the month of March there were 41 job postings.

Constituent Services: On March 2021, we had 63 constituencies compared to 70 in February. These number are still much higher than normal for our commission primarily due to COVID-19 related inquires primarily now due to the vaccination inquiries.

Intern / Volunteers: Two OSU Interns have been working on the OLANET, Latino Media and Central Ohio Directories projects. Our OSU School of Social Work intern has been working on our CLOI directory and expects to complete it by April. and Mackenzie D. continues interning with PPC Officer Carly McCain, and our 2nd OSU Social Work School intern, Jorge Rodriguez is diligently working with the ODC. We have a total of 5 Interns with OCHLA as of present, but will be losing 3 at the end of April or early May as they will be graduating.

Translations: Doing the month of March we have worked on 12 translations, revisions and updates.

Social Media Outreach and Engagement:

In March, OCHLA continued to see a steady incline throughout its social media platforms. The SMC has implemented guidelines that involve distributing the most relevant and necessary information on social media in hopes to keep the audience engaged and to make our platforms a reliable source for important community updates. There were just above 17,000 impressions and only 48 posts across Instagram, Facebook, Twitter, and LinkedIn. The number of job opportunities submitted and posted on our website has greatly increased in the last few months, and the webpage continues to be one of our most viewed pages. Throughout the month of March OCHLA has shared resources regarding the COVID-19 Vaccine, Promotoras de Salud webinar, and the final Hispanic Impact Campaign featuring Selina Pagan, which received the most engagements (1,500 people reached) throughout the month. The commission also continues to release Mike DeWines' press conferences with latest updates regarding the coronavirus pandemic.

Facebook:

OCHLA's Facebook continues to move at a much slower pace than other platforms, considering the nature of Facebook, this is no surprise.

Twitter:

OCHLA's twitter continues to rise in followers. It has gained almost 100 new followers since July 2020. In March there were over 10,000 impressions, and 1000 profile visits.

Instagram:

The Commission's Instagram received 45 profile visits, and 650 impressions. A 36% increase from last month.

Website:

We are in the process of revamping the website with modifications to the Community Network, Latest News, ODC, and Commissioners landing pages. We also created two new pages housing information for the Promotoras [de Salud](#), as well as the [Opioid Education Resources Page](#). Within the next few weeks, we plan to update the Public Policy landing page, along with the Homepage. The website received over 1600 views as created and marketed our new user-friendly pages. The top pages of the website were: Job Opportunities- 400 page views; Hispanic Impact – 186 page views; Hispanic Impact- 180 page views.
